COLLECTION DETAILS

Historical Note

Founded in 1992, Massachusetts Jobs with Justice (JwJ) is a Boston-based branch of National Jobs with Justice that has partnered with local community, faith, and labor organizations to promote labor justice and other social justice issues. JwJ has been active in Eastern Massachusetts over the last forty years, working with its member organizations to support workers' right to organize, immigrant rights, universal health care, and global justice. JwJ has also organized campaigns against free trade initiatives and corporate greed. JwJ has created or sponsored many other organizations and projects like the Workers' Rights Board, the Student Action Labor Project, and Solidarity School. Massachusetts JwJ is only one of many local coalitions with similar goals that all work together under the leadership of National JwJ. As a whole, JwJ has focused on building coalitions across lines of union membership, race, gender, sexuality, and immigration status, encouraging members to pledge to show up for issues that might not directly impact them in the interest of strengthening workers' rights as a whole.

Scope and Content Note

The Massachusetts Jobs with Justice Records document the history of Massachusetts Jobs with Justice (MA JwJ) from its founding in 1992 until 2013, although the bulk of the documentation ends around 2007. The collection includes materials relating to the organizational structure, daily operations, finances, and outreach strategies of MA JwJ. There are also materials related to the organizing of MA JwJ campaigns, including strategy planning notes, meeting minutes, flyers, and correspondence. Of particular note are documents relating to anti-globalization protests in Massachusetts, Seattle, Quebec, and elsewhere; materials relating to campaigns for immigrant rights and the rights of health care workers; and materials from the Justice for Janitors campaign, which advocated for the labor rights of janitorial workers at institutions such as universities and hotels in the Boston area. In addition, the collection contains a large amount of material related to organizations which MA JwJ created or played a significant role in running or supporting. Some of these organizations include the Workers' Rights Board, the Student Labor Action Plan (SLAP), and the Boston Global Action Network (BGAN). The collection also includes materials produced by other local chapters of JwJ, the national governing structure of JwJ, and other organizations doing labor and social justice work that were members of or otherwise involved with MA JwJ. Additionally, the collection includes materials produced by the Center for Labor Education and Research (CLEAR), which was a parent organization and financial sponsor of both MA JwJ and a variety of other nonprofit organizations. Also of value are newspaper clippings about MA JwJ activities and (largely Boston-area) labor issues, as well as a collection of resource files relating to issues of interest to the organization. Finally, the collection includes photographs and videos of certain MA JwJ activities, some of which are available digitally.
